**A FREE cancer awareness event is set to take place in Bournemouth.**

The Dorset Indian Association, in partnership with Wessex Cancer Alliance, Bournemouth University, Dorset Healthcare University NHS Foundation Trust and LiveWell Dorset, is organising the event on Saturday, June 7.

It will take place from 10.30am to 1pm at Bournemouth Gateway Building in St Paul's Lane.

The event is primarily aimed at ethnic minority groups living in Dorset.

Consultants from the University Hospitals Dorset NHS Foundation Trust will be giving talks on preventing and detecting lung, prostate and gynaecological cancers.

There will also be advice on breast screening and health checks from the Dorset Breast Screening Unit, LiveWell Dorset and the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences at Bournemouth University.

Attendees will be informed about the signs and symptoms of lung, prostate and gynaecological cancers and what to do if they have any concerns.

There will also be opportunities to book a brief health MOT with LiveWell Dorset and receive further health and wellbeing advice.

The event will also provide a platform to learn about Bournemouth University's new cancer and health research initiatives, with opportunities to get involved.

The event is free, with tea, coffee and lunch provided.
